Where a member has an interest which is sufficient to give rise to a reasonable expectation that they will not be able to consider a matter impartially, for example where they have a close personal relationship with a party involved, where they have made a public and unequivocal statement of their views etc, this is a disclosable, but non-pecuniary, interest. They should declare this interest at the start of the meeting and may remain in the room and speak (provided members of the public would also be allowed to speak on this item). Members who have declared an interest of this type may not, however, vote on the item to which their interest applies.
- **4.** Where a member becomes aware of an interest during discussion, they must declare it immediately and act accordingly.

#### P005 PROCESSING APPLICATIONS FOR 5G MASTS

The Town Clerk gave an overview of his report including the legislation and planning laws written by Government restricting the grounds on which objections can be made. As general objections, not site-specific, could be seen as pre-determination (which would weaken, or even undermine the strength of any objections) and the truncated time within which Herefordshire must determine such applications placed a heavy burden on the City Council, the planning guidelines permitted objections only on fairly limited grounds. The law was weighted in favour of applications because the government sees them as essential to rolling out high speed broadband connectivity which is part of its overall economic strategy. Although there are general concerns about health indications held by some, including some scientists, they are not public policy and cannot be relied upon as grounds for planning objections. There is no power for developers to be required to send all their proposals for an area in one set so they can all be evaluated and the least damaging sites selected. They can submit them whenever they wish. In order to avoid missing the consultation deadline, Members could decide to call additional special meetings to consider the applications, or they could use a modified delegation to officers. The paper set out these options in detail for consideration.

In considering the proposals, members noted that additional meetings created workload for officers and members and that the Committee already met more often than any other in order to cope with the numbers of applications it was asked to review. If any proposed objections were verified by the ward member, and subsequently ratified or withdrawn by Committee, democratic accountability could be combined with speed of response.

It was proposed by Councillor Tyler, seconded by Councillor Andrews and unanimously

#### **RESOLVED:**

To instruct the Clerk and officers that, where local residents place objections to a 5G mast application that are within the limited grounds allowed under planning regulations, the

officers will automatically lodge a similar objection within the time limit and that this will be affirmed or withdrawn by the Committee at the next available meeting.

#### RECONSIDERATION OF DELEGATED AUTHORITY REGARDING 5g MASTS

#### 1. Suspension of Standing Orders

- 1.1 Standing Order 7a prohibits the reversal of a decision once it is resolved within six months. It is debateable whether the proposal that follows is a reversal, or a modification of the resolution reached at the last meeting concerning a provision for objections to be lodged to 5g mast applications in certain circumstances under delegated authority to officers.
- 1.2 For the avoidance of any doubt as to the admissibility of further consideration of this matter, it is recommended that before giving it any further consideration the Committee records a resolution to invoke Standing Order 26a which reads:

"All or part of a standing order .... may be suspended may be suspended by resolution in relation to consideration of an item on the agenda for a meeting."

2. RECOMMENDATION That the Committee resolves to suspend Standing Order 7a to enable consideration of the item on the agenda in relation to 5g masts.

#### 3. Background

- 3.1 At its last meeting the Committee considered the need to make responses to 5g mast applications within a much tighter timescale than applies to routine planning applications, and the restricted grounds allowed under planning law and policy. These applications were generating both some concern among a section of the community who believe the masts to be intrinsically undesirable and a concern that, as the Committee meets every four weeks, some responses may miss the deadline. In order to solve that problem, the Committee resolved that where there is an objection from the community that is within the grounds allowed and appears to be supportable the Clerk or other officer would act under delegated authority act to lodge a provisional objection with the Planning Authority which would be reported to this Committee for ratification, amendment or withdrawal. One such objection appears on this agenda.
- 3.2 After the resolution, as the Clerk was leaving the meeting, he was asked by the members of the public who had attended what "local" meant and offered the suggestion that it should be within the ward. This was not received well, and he then said that we would consider observations from anyone in the City but would naturally be more interested in the comments of those more closely affected. This was a genuine attempt to achieve a reasonable understanding as to how we should proceed.
- 3.3 Unfortunately, one couple have taken this to mean that whenever they lodge an objection, regardless of how remotely they live from the site, or indeed whether anyone living locally has supported their objection, the council is somehow obligated to reflect their concerns, exactly as stated and repeat then as council objections. This is neither the wording nor the intention of the committee resolution. There was no intention of giving one household an over-arching power to determine the council's position, but rather to enable a brisk and effective response to support genuine local objections.

3.4 In order to remove any doubt about how we will proceed further, it is necessary to add to the earlier definition a clarification of who's objections will be considered for support under delegated officer authority. It should also be noted that this measure was introduced at a time when we were in mid-elections, some wards did not therefore have a currently elected representative and purdah rules would have prevented the Clerk from seeking views from a candidate without asking them all. That is no longer the case, and we have an elected representative in every ward.

#### 4. Proposal

- 4.1 It is suggested that in order to clarify the arrangement and to uphold the constitutional fact that the Council exists to represent all the citizens of the city as considered appropriate by its elected members, and not by any local pressure group, however articulate they may be, that a definition is added to the earlier resolution. As the masts are in specific localities which might be on ward boundaries it is not sensible to restrict this by ward, as some people living on the other side of a road from a mast might be much closer to it than people in the same ward living some streets back.
- 4.2 It is important that ward members are built up in their role as representatives of their local communities and regardless of membership of this Committee should be involved in this process. However, it would be unlawful for individual members to make decisions, so while their comments should be included in any submission the Clerk makes to the Planning Authority, they cannot determine the matter alone.

#### 5. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 5.1 That consideration of objections to proposed installations of 5g masts must be site specific and within the constraints allowed under planning law.
- 5.2 That for the purpose of a delegated officer decision to object in support of local objectors, the term 'local' shall in this case mean people resident within a 500 metre circle of any proposed installation.
- 5.3 That, before any objection is raised under delegated authority by an officer, the ward member shall be consulted and enabled to state their view, which shall be added to any objection the officer may make.
